

Alumni Update

CHAPTER ETERNAL

Arthur N. Evans Jr. '44 entered Chapter Eternal on February 24, 2013. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served in World War II in the South Pacific as a Sea Bee Ensign. After military service, Arthur returned to Columbus, Texas, and continued the construction business started by his parents. He served as a building contractor since 1947 and handled both commercial and residential construction. He also specialized in the restoration of many of the historic landmarks of Columbus. He was a lifetime member of the First United Methodist Church and served on the church board. He was involved in community service and was a member of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign War. He was a member of the University of Texas Ex-Students Association and served as president of the Colorado County School Board. He is survived by his wife, Fay, and children, William and Amy.

George D. Tarry Jr. '45 entered Chapter Eternal on March 20, 2013. His college years were interrupted when he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force as a pilot instructor. He worked for the Texas Highway Department in Houston before he transferred to Tyler in 1957, where he retired as the assistant district engineer in 1980. George was a member of Marvin United Methodist Church and was active in the Tyler Rotary Club and many professional organizations. He enjoyed playing tennis, visiting his farm in Mixon, and spending time with his grandchildren. George will be remembered most for his patience, encouragement, and love for others, his integrity and quick wit, which endeared him to so many people. He is survived by his wife, Patricia, and their son, Radford.

George W. Chandler '47 entered Chapter Eternal on March 7, 2013, after living all of his life in Baytown, Texas. He was a member of the Merchant Marines before proudly serving in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He was sent to the University of Texas in Austin for officer training and also attended Harvard University where he took graduate business courses and became a member of the esteemed Hasty Pudding Club. He returned to Baytown in 1949 to practice law and served as Baytown's city attorney for 17 years. He continued his private practice until he retired in 1997. He and his wife, Freda, married in 1947 and had five children. George loved exercise, being in nature, and was a consummate volunteer. He spent years promoting, fundraising, and serving as president of the Baytown YMCA.

Richard "Jack" Schwarz '47 entered Chapter Eternal on May 6, 2013. He served in the U.S. Army from 1943 to 1959, exiting with the rank of captain. During his service, Jack was awarded the American Theater Campaign Ribbon, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal, Victory Ribbon, and Army Occupation Ribbon (Japan). He was a member of the St. James Episcopal Church in San Antonio and worked and retired from the Texas Animal Health Commission. He is survived by his wife, Audrey, two daughters, one son, three step children, 15 grandchildren, and 25 great-grandchildren.

William T. Cortelyou '57 entered Chapter Eternal on April 14, 2013. He was preceded in death by his wife of 42 years, Ann, and is survived by his wife of nine years, Bette, three children, and five grandchildren. Bill served as an Army lieutenant in El Paso after college, and in 1960 joined IBM where he held positions in client education, marketing, and consulting. Bill was an Eagle Scout and over the years served in

Shreveport, Texas, as a Scout master, president of the Piermont Oak Tennis Club, Board of Directors of the United Way and Salvation Army, and deacon of First Presbyterian Church. In Dallas he was an active member of Park Cities Presbyterian Church. Bill enjoyed hunting, woodworking, golf, and was an avid Civil War and WWII history buff.
