ALUMNI AID FALL RECRUITMENT

Chapter President Garrett Williams '15 shared that more than 50 new pledges signed and started pledgeship for the fall semester. The chapter recruitment team was well organized this year, and we were able to send out a postcard soliciting rush funds, just over \$8,111 from 53 donors was collected. The total amount was passed on to the chapter to support their budget. The Alumni Association covered the mailing/printing cost of the solicitation (\$2,800 or about \$1.15/piece). Thank you to all those alumni that participated in this special appeal!

ANNUAL CONTRIBUTIONS GREATLY APPRECIATED

I always give a special thanks to our Alumni Association annual campaign donors. For the regular spring solicitation we had 93 total donors, raising \$21,066. Notably, 29 of the 93 donors were first-time campaign donors. I hope that many of you have had the opportunity to see where your contributions are being invested, including the upgraded courtyard at the Shelter (permanent beverage trough and flagstone patio replacing the flower beds), privacy fence near the back parking lot for storage,

recruitment mailing costs as noted above, and all the continued alumni communications, newsletters, and mailings. The next two investments underway are improving the sports court area by adding a flagstone patio border between the court and the Shelter and building our first Alumni Association Internet footprint that will include password-protected access to the Gamma Iota alumni database, a website, and the ability to send out regular (and less costly) alumni news/communication. REMEMBERING TO GIVE BACK

Peyton L. Townsend Jr. '62 Wants Delt to Remain Strong



o remember that this is your home, the place where you made friends and came of age, a place that will be part of you forever, and of which you will be forever a part. Remember to come home now and then, both in spirit and in fact. Wherever you go from here, send us a postcard—along with your check—and we will keep you in our hearts." Dr. William S. Livingston, spoke those words during the spring 1999 commencement address, and **Peyton L. Townsend Jr.**'62 thinks they apply to both the university and to the fraternity.

Peyton's choice to join Gamma Iota was easy because his father had been a Delt and there were two Delts on his block that he had grown up with, Bill Cortelyou '57 and Bob Dickson '60. "I loved the whole damn thing—intramurals, rush, parties, just hanging out at the Shelter." He encourages undergraduates to enjoy their time in the chapter but to keep their studies in shape for whatever they want to do after school. As an alumnus, Peyton finds time to give back to both UT and Gamma Iota.

"I believe we had one of the best fraternities, if not the best when I was on campus. I think the Delts have produced more distinguished alumni at UT than any chapter on campus, and we have initiated more Delts than any other chapter in the country. It's very simple: if we don't continue to support our chapter, then it will be hard for it to remain strong. I have a number of friends who were in other fraternities, and they are still very supportive of their chapters.

"I personally got a lot out of my fraternity experience, and I would guess almost all would feel the same way. If that is in fact true, then I feel it's incumbent on us to support the chapter to whatever extent we can."

CHAPTER ETERNAL

John P. Harbin '39 passed on to Chapter Eternal July 26 at age 97. He had a shrewd mind for business. Born and raised in Waxahachie, Texas, during the Depression, his famous work ethic, combined with a keen sense of adventure and humor, was the foundation of a long and illustrious life. He often said, "I've never known an eight-hour day." That driven young man grew up to be a



legendary oilman, financial executive, philanthropist, and influential member of the Dallas community and his name graces the home of the Ex-Students' Association on the Forty Acres: the Etter-Harbin Alumni Center.

Throughout his travels, Harbin never forgot his Longhorn roots. He was a great friend to the university and especially to the Texas Exes. A member of the College of Business Administration Foundation and the Chancellor's Council, he was elected to the College of Business Hall of Fame in 1985. In 1981 he was presented with the Distinguished Alumnus Award and later served as president of the association in 1989-90. Harbin also gave the largest single donation ever made to the association and underwrote major renovations to the center twice. In 2001, the center was renamed in his honor.

Perrin W. White '49 entered Chapter Eternal March 18. He was very proud of both his degree and his service to our nation. Perrin spent more than 60 years in the lumber, building, development, and real estate businesses which took him to New Orleans, Las Vegas, Anchorage, and one of the joys of his life, Australia. During his lifetime, Perrin was a humble and modest man of many personal accomplishments. He felt strongly that Houston had been so good to him and his family for so many years that he was compelled to give back to the city he loved. While quietly contributing to many charities, he was a strong supporter of the Star of Hope Mission, Second Baptist Church, Texas Heart Institute, and the International Bible Society.

John H. Tull Jr. '71 passed on to Chapter Eternal June 25, after having embraced a robust life and health challenges with equal courage and fortitude.

Kevin T. Shea '94, beloved husband, father, son and brother, passed away on April 28, 2013, in Humble, Texas. He is survived by his wife, Tammy Wavle Shea, and their three children.
