## STRONG FINANCIAL SUPPORT RECEIVED, BUT MORE NEEDED TO REACH OUR \$9.5 MILLION GOAL

e have officially topped \$7 million with an impressive \$7,178,735 committed to the *Texas Delts: Continuing the Tradition* campaign. More than 290 alumni have chosen to support and invest in the future of Texas Delt, and I am extremely thankful and proud to be a part of this campaign.

Raising more than \$7 million is a huge milestone we needed to hit on our way to our goal. But it's just that—a milestone. **We must hit \$9.5 million.** 

#### What Will \$9.5 Million Do?

- Ensure our project can move forward as envisioned.
- Bring Michal Hsu Office of Architecture's design to life, turning the Shelter into the preeminent fraternity house in Austin and across the country.
- Address mandatory life-safety issues with sprinklers, fire-rated doors, and full compliance with code specifications.
- Complete a full interior renovation, including expanding dining hall capacity to 130 men, redesigning bedrooms, and providing ample meeting and study space, among many other upgrades.
- Bring all this to life with minimal debt exposure for the chapter and House Corporation.

In addition to raising \$9.5 million, we need 1,000 Texas Delt donors and 40% participation. To date, we sit at 294 donors and 12% participation. We know we can reach our goal if more brothers pitch in. Our annual campaign had more than 460 donors—we should have that many, if not more, to this crucial campaign. With many other fraternities on campus doing major renovations, we will be left behind if we do not do this project now and do it right.



## Delt Runs in the Family

## Bob '81 and Vince Carrozza '18 on Lifelong Brotherhood

hile unfamiliar with Delta Tau Delta before college, Bob Carrozza '81 found the brothers he met during recruitment to be a breath of fresh air. "The small-town Delts I met were so different from the big-city kids I grew up with," he reminisced. "Their positive attitudes, country ways, and one-liners had an authenticity that captivated me!"

When his son, Vince Carrozza '18, enrolled at UT, Bob deliberately avoided pushing the Texas Delts on him to let him make his own decision. Nonetheless, the family tradition persisted, and Vince even took the reigns as president of his member class.

"It was a great way to connect with the campus around me and an easy introduction to college life," Vince said. "The brothers seemed like they would always have my back in life. Having my father as a Delt made parent's weekends an absolute blast too!"

Bob began a career in real estate after graduating, eventually becoming president of Center City Inc., where he has served for 30 years. He describes it as a "small family office, maintaining an active but highly diversified portfolio." Vince took a similar career path, thanks largely to Delt influence; fraternity connections helped him land his first finance job as well as his first full-time job at Swearingen Realty Group.


"I like social-heavy work and getting out of the office, so this was the perfect path for me." Bob, too, is thankful to the chapter for helping him build the confidence and social skills instrumental to his success.

The lessons and advantages gained through Delta Tau Delta inspired both father and son to contribute a family gift to the Texas Delt campaign. The Carrozzas each recognize the need to update the Shelter to remain competitive for recruitment. "Potential new members pay close attention to house location and amenities," Vince noted. "All the other fraternities are upgrading, and Delt needs to do the same to stay relevant."

Bob encourages everyone to think of their own experiences, as well as those of the generation to come, and give at whatever level they are comfortable with. "Think of the brothers whom you might encourage to give as well," Bob said.

Bob is continuously impressed with the active chapter. "They are perhaps even better at preparing themselves for the future, and from what I can

tell they still know how to enjoy themselves." Bob and Vince both love visiting the Shelter and tailgates when they can. "Delt has always had the best tailgates," Vince said. "We are closest to the stadium and we smoke an incredible brisket. If I'm ever in Austin for a game, I'm going to the tailgate."

For father and son, some of the best Delt memories involve simply shooting the breeze and spending time with their brothers. Vince shared a vivid memory in particular: "We were all eating dinner, and suddenly Matthew McConaughey '92 struts in, sits down at the table, and starts telling stories. It wasn't a celebrity moment and wasn't treated as such; it was just Delt brothers casually swapping stories. It was an awesome moment and an inspiration to know some very successful people have started from the same spot we are."

Bob lives in Dallas and enjoys catching up with brothers in the area. "Visiting a brother I haven't seen in years feels like stepping back in time...a time never forgotten and always appreciated!" Vince added, "I work with them. I go on trips with them. I go to football games with them. Delt is very much still in my life." Both like hunting, fishing, and outdoors in general, and most weekends Bob and his wife leave the big city to relax at his ranch. "Of course, one of my Longhorns is named Bevo!"

## ALUMNI UPDATE

#### **CHAPTER ETERNAL**

Craig C. Hill '47 entered Chapter Eternal on May 6, 2019, at the age of 91 after a battle with multiple systems atrophy. He was thankful for the support he received from his caregivers. Craig and his wife of 62 years, Heather, enjoyed traveling with different friend groups. Craig had a wide range of talents as an architect, editor, inventor, poet, and translator of *The Complete Works of La Fontaine*.

Henry B. Mobley '50 entered Chapter Eternal on December 19, 2018. During Henry's childhood and young adult years, he became an accomplished pianist and especially enjoyed playing music from the Big Band Swing Era. Playing the piano was strongly therapeutic in helping him recover from residual left arm weakness due to polio. In 1961, Henry opened a private practice in downtown Dallas where he worked for the next 20 years. He then worked as a consultant for the office of Workers' Compensation Programs for 23 years before retiring at the age of 85.

Henry read voraciously and was educated in subjects as diverse as world history, culture, anthropology, physics, chemistry, geology, biology, mathematics, and astronomy. He was an active member of Holy Trinity Parish since 1963. Henry and his wife, Vivian, celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary in October of 2018.

H. Gorman Ritchie Jr. '52 entered Chapter Eternal at the age of 87 on January 18, 2019. Gorman and his wife, Marietta, shared 57 years of marriage and had three children. He proudly served in the 32nd Tank Battalion of the 3rd Armored Division (Patton's Armored Division). Following his honorable discharge in 1957, Gorman practiced law and helped with the family's businesses.

Gorman wore many hats as a farmer, rancher, attorney, airplane pilot, cotton ginner (Taft Gin and Seed Company), inventor, peanut grower,

Rotarian, bank director (First National Bank of Taft), fish farm operator, senior league baseball coach, city councilman, mayor, and lifetime Longhorn. Above all, Gorman was a loving husband, father, grandfather, and Christian, serving for decades as one of the elders at the Church of Christ in Portland, Texas.

Richard Keeton '59 entered Chapter Eternal at the age of 81 on April 20, 2019, in Houston, Texas. Richard was an extremely talented and competitive tennis player. Unofficially, he won many ping-pong competitions at the Delt Shelter where he went equally unmatched. Richard relished his career as an attorney for well over five decades. In 1968, Richard took a sabbatical from Vinson and Elkins to work for the Robert F. Kennedy campaign, where he was responsible for organizing the clergy. Any time spent with friends over a game of gin rummy or around the dinner table was a special one for him.

For over 50 years he was married to the love of his life and best friend, Susan Booth Keeton. Richard was a member of the Tejas Breakfast Club, The Coronado Club, Allegro, and The Houston Racquet Club. Richard and Susan were both devoted to the civic life of Houston and have been long-time supporters of several local non-profits, including Hermann Park Conservancy and Buffalo Bayou Partnership.

"Get your aim right and follow it. At the same time, you may find something else within your vocation that you naturally become better at and love to



do. If that happens, don't be afraid to pivot," Matthew said. "Also, take risks. Don't leave this life regretting not trying something you know you want and need. Fail more often than you may be comfortable with. It's not really a risk unless you can lose the fight."

Another prominent Gamma Iota Chapter brother took time to recognize Matthew's success earlier this year. In February, Texas Governor **Greg Abbott '80** presented Matthew with the Texas Medal of Arts Award for film. The award is presented biennially to Texas leaders and luminaries who have achieved unparalleled success with their creative skills and provided the opportunity for Texans to thrive in the arts.

As a Golden Globe and an Oscar winner for his performance in *Dallas Buyers Club*, Matthew has proven that anything is possible if you just keep livin'. Through all of his success, he's thankful for the support of his Delt brothers.

"I remain friends with so many Delt brothers and continue to do business with so many of them," Matthew said. "My family spends time with so many of their families."

In addition to his professional success, Matthew remains passionate about giving back to others.
