Annual Donors Influence Gamma Iota's Success

Let me start by saying thank you to 25 and to 100. In the past year, there have been 25 first-time donors and 100 repeat donors to the Texas Delts annual campaign. I hope that all 125 of you will be repeat donors in the future. We continue to make strides increasing our participation rate, and I hope that we will be able to report improvements over the coming years.

We have had 258 total donors since we started the Texas Delts annual giving program in 2009 out of approximately 2,300 living alumni (11%). Based on this participation level, you can tell that most of the 258 donors since inception are repeat donors. The participation rate should be much higher. As I always say, it's not the amount you give, it's the fact you give something to an organization that helped shaped your early years in life.

Only a few of you (including me) have taken advantage of the recurring credit card gift option. It's an easy way to setup a recurring gift of a small amount that does not hit your pocketbook. I ask you to consider this simple way to give a small monthly amount that adds up over a 12-month period. Take note in this newsletter of two alumni who both consistently support the annual campaign, **Robert Strait '77** and **Ellis Winstanley '03**, and what they say about giving back.

I know many of you were able to attend the Texas Delt alumni events that took place on the first weekend of November. As I reported in the letter sent shortly afterward, we had an amazing weekend celebrating Judy Abbott's 25 years at the Shelter and heard words of wisdom from Texas Attorney General **Greg Abbott '80** as he enters an important year as the front runner for the next Governor of Texas. 


Today, Ellis stays involved as an alumnus by serving on the

CHAPTER ETERNAL

F. Blair Reeves '43 passed on to Chapter Eternal March 12, 2012. He was a professor emeritus of architecture at the University of Florida. Born in Beaumont, Texas, Blair served in the infantry during World War II. He met his wife, Mary Nell Gibson, at the University of Texas. They moved to Gainesville in 1949 when Blair joined the architectural faculty. As an architect specializing in education and preservation, Blair established architectural preservation programs and, with Walter Beinecke, cofounded the Preservation Institute: Nantucket (PIN), now in its 40th year.

A trustee emeritus of the National Trust for Historic Preservation and one of the founders of the Florida Trust for Historic Preservation, Blair received the National Trust's Louise du Pont Crowninshield Award, the Department of Interior's Conservation Service Award, and Florida Trust's 1998 Evelyn Fortune Bartlett Award for Lifetime Achievement in Preservation Stewardship. In 1988, the governor passed a resolution acknowledging his many contributions to the preservation movement in Florida. In 1995, the BeineckeReeves Distinguished Professor Chair in Architectural Preservation was established. In 2005, Blair received the Senator Bob Williams Award given in recognition of his public service that forever changed the course of historic preservation in Florida.

I've also been in discussion with Mavericks owner Mark Cuban. He recently showed interest in working with me on MSpaces and taking its development further.
- Q: What lessons that you learned from the fraternity have you used in your professional experience?
- A: The intensity of work in pledgeship has carried over to my professional career. The biggest lesson I learned was to stop thinking/planning/trying to make everything perfect and just go do it.
- Q: What are your feelings on the importance of leadership?
- A: Leadership is the most important trait for success. You can only get so far by yourself. The most successful people in the world are heads of companies or politics, where their sole job is to be a leader.
