ALUMNI LEAD TEXAS DELTS TO SUCCESS

Gamma Iota Celebrates Successful Year, Looks Forward to 2015

The new year is off to a busy start, but let's take a moment to reflect on the past year's accomplishments and set goals for the next twelve months.

Highlights included:

- Hosted largest ever Gamma Iota alumni and chapter officer offsite hosted at Falcon Point Ranch (www.falconpointranch.com) in February with 14 alumni and the full executive board of the chapter participating
- Completed upgrading flagstone border of the sports court
- Supported the chapter rush officers by collecting \$8,111 from 53 alumni donors combined with \$2,800 contributed from the association for a total of \$10,911 to support the chapter's summer recruitment effort
- Hosted a successful Alumni Weekend in November with guest speaker Bryan Davis, former lead academic advisor for the Texas football program
- Awarded seven scholarships totaling \$9,000 to worthy members for academics and leadership from the Parlin Foundation [sister 501(c)(3) foundation to the Texas Delts Alumni Association]
- Celebrated 2014 Chapter President Garrett
 Williams '15 for being selected as IFC
 President of the Year by the UT Greek
 Community

This does not include many other notable chapter achievements highlighted in the article by Chapter President **Thomas Gilman '16** on page six. Hands down, 2014 was a great year for Gamma Iota.

As always, there is a new crop of officers taking the helm and they are thrust into the annual western plains division conference hosted by the central office and the next annual alumni and officer off-site, both in the month of February. These two events are scheduled to help officers transition effectively into their duties as best possible and to plan for the balance of the year. As when we were all in school, their task is to build on the achievements of the prior year, and I know the group is capable of this success.

I want to give a special thanks to our Alumni Association annual campaign donors. For the fall appeal we raised \$10,725 from 63 donors. When combined with the spring and recruitment appeals, we raised a total of \$41,677 for all of 2014 from 215 donors. This compares favorably to 2013 funds raised of \$23,832 from 142 donors and two appeals. A notable difference year over year was the addition of the rush appeal, which we plan to do again in 2015.

You may have noticed this last November we launched the Texas Delts alumni website - www. TexasDeltAlumni.com-and began regular e-mail communication with alumni. I hope that you have found these additional connections helpful to deliver more timely communications. Additionally, we continue to invest in the future of Gamma Iota, including the Shelter with targeted improvements, recruitment, and all the continued alumni communications, newsletters, and mailings. The next two Alumni Association investments on our list are a new grill and new furniture for the study room. No contribution is too small and each contribution is very much appreciated, so please support our efforts. Visit the new alumni website to see how easy it is to give back.


Richard E. Francis Jr. '84 Encourages Alumni to Contribute to Rush

Undergraduate Spotlight on Max Richards '15

Q: Why did you decide to join the fraternity?
