Each of us committed to a lifetime membership in Delta Tau Delta during initiation. Now it's on us to ensure that membership still benefits

undergraduates and alumni alike. Take this opportunity to connect with another brother and check-in on him during this difficult time. Our primary focus for the last few weeks has been making sure our brothers are taken care of and provided for. Even with these challenging times, the need has not changed. Our goal is still to reach \$9.5 million raised to fund our project.

Delt Experience Provided Matt Boles '91 with Compass and Energy to Succeed, Inspires Campaign Support

From his first party at the Shelter, Matt Boles
'91 was absolutely sure he wanted to be a part
of the Delt brotherhood. Coming from a small
town, he had no clue about fraternities, but all the
camaraderie, fun, and laughs he had at that party
sold him on being a Texas Delt. Once a member, he
began paving his path to a full life with his brothers
by his side.

"There's no doubt that being a Texas Delt shaped my personal and professional life," he said. "It gave me a larger perspective on life and the opportunities that were available."

Although Matt joined as a sophomore and an established business major, he had no idea what he wanted to do professionally. He credits his Delt brothers for helping him find his way to a rewarding career. He has enjoyed being a public finance banker for the last 28 years, all with RBC Capital Markets in Dallas.

"I studied with several Delts, and we became serious about school and aggressively pursuing our careers," he shared. "There's no doubt that my Delt friendships gave me direction and energy to excel."

Looking back on his undergraduate years, the Shelter was home to many of his favorite memories—most of all, the laughs. Matt recalled

Navigating the challenges of a large campus showed Matt first-hand the importance of providing a positive and life-changing experience for brothers following in our footsteps. And the first step is renovating the Shelter.

"We need to be best-in-class when we recruit and part of that involves providing a topflight house," Matt stated. "We're years behind others at UT and now is the time."

Matt and his wife, Emily, live in Dallas with their 7-year-old son, Knox, who already wants to be a Texas Delt. "I think it's because he's witnessed what my Delt friendships mean to me. His godfather is a Texas Delt, and that's pretty darn cool." Two or three times a year, Matt and some of his Delt brothers get together to fish, play golf, go hunting, and there are football games and reunions regularly. WHAT'S BEHIND THE NAME? AND WHAT IS THE DELT CONNECTION?

Dean Keeton Street is part of Delt life because of its proximity to the Shelter. To honor Dean Page Keeton, the legendary dean of the University of Texas Law School for 25 years and a major influence in Texas, the City of Austin changed the street name to honor this great man. Early in his deanship he stood up for faculty members' right to free speech against powerful alumni and politicians who wanted to silence or remove them, at great risk to his own job. Over time he built a great law school and became one of the most influential men in Texas, beloved by legions of alumni from every point on the political spectrum.

Dean Keeton was not a Delt, but Delts have a special connection to this family.

Dean Page and Madge Keeton once chaperoned Delt parties. Why? They were supportive Delt parents. Their son, Richard '59, was a proud Delt all of his life. During the late '50s and early '60s, Richard helped recruit many young men to Delta Tau Delta, contributed to the culture by helping Delts dominate in intramurals (and being dominant himself in late-night ping pong, bridge, and poker games), was active in the Texas Cowboys (he fired the cannon during many Longhorn wins), and played as the number one ranked player on the UT tennis team, where he won conference championships during his three years. Richard was a brilliant student. He spent one year at Harvard Medical School (but hated the sight of blood), joined the U.S. Army Reserves, then returned to UT Law School and the Delts, including participating in rush, intramurals, campus politics, and the late-night activities. Still, he managed to graduate first in his class and started work at the large Houston law firm Vinson & Elkins. He continued to shine there and, during a period of rapid growth, helped this firm attract scores of outstanding lawyers, including several Delts.

After 16 years at V&E, he continued a great legal career as a renowned expert in business litigation and helped launch several successful boutique law firms. Last year at Richard's memorial services, his eulogy was delivered by Delt and lifelong friend **John Murchison '63** in front of a large crowd of family and friends, including many Delts who had known and loved Richard for decades.
