Capital Campaign Coming to a Close on June 30 Will You Help Gamma Iota Reach the Finish Line?

As you're all aware, Gamma Iota has been making big strides during a marathon of its own, thanks to the generous efforts of alumni who have contributed to the *Texas Delts:*Continuing the Tradition capital campaign. - We expect actual construction costs to exceed the original estimate produced back in 2017, so raising more money helps us deliver a better renovation. We also don't want to limit what we can do to the house.
- We'd like to have extra funds on hand to cover future property expenses and to fund general upkeep.
- We'd like to be the number one capital campaign at Texas so we can have bragging rights!

Whether it's been from the brothers who helped build the Shelter or those who have served on the House Corporation, we all benefited from the Delts who preceded us. This is our chance to give back to Gamma Iota and benefit our brotherhood for generations to come. All gifts, no matter the size, are greatly appreciated as we close in on the finish line. We would also love to give you the special recognition of including your name on the Delt Donor Wall, which can be secured with a minimum gift or pledge of \$5.000.

Distance running and making financial contributions are both difficult when you're doing them alone. However, both objectives are easier when aiming to achieve a common goal with your best friends. As a freshman from a small town attending a large university like the University of Texas, Sandy Watkins '70 didn't feel socially comfortable going through recruitment. Despite not joining a fraternity his first year at UT, he started spending a lot of time at the Gamma Iota Shelter and becoming good friends with Delts like Bubby Lee '70. Sandy elected to sign up for recruitment as a sophomore, but still didn't go through. It didn't take long for Bubby to give Sandy a call to let him know that the chapter voted to let him join. That

"I got a lot from Gamma Iota. It changed my life and I owed it to them," Sandy said. "There are several guys that got a huge benefit from the Delt experience who haven't supported this effort. That isn't right, so I felt obligated to help. It isn't a lot of money to give when it's spread over time. Giving back is the right thing to do."

Sandy has shared many laughs with his brothers over the years, from

pranks he pulled with Scott Smith '71 as an undergraduate to couples trips to Mexico as an alumnus. It's important to Sandy for the Gamma Iota undergraduates and future Delts to also develop self-confidence and lifelong friendships, and he's doing his part to make that possible by giving to the campaign.

The self-confidence Sandy gained from Gamma Iota has paid huge dividends throughout his career as an entrepreneur. He's been a part of founding 14 companies over the past 40 years. Sandy is the chairman of Open Lending, which he founded in 2000 in Austin.

Perseverance and not being willing to fail are traits one learns. It has also been a blessing and great joy to mentor young people and see them develop."

As his brothers do the same with their respective families, Sandy hopes that they'll reflect on the qualities that Gamma Iota instilled in them. CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The construction process continues with site permits and final plans. As many know, Austin can be a difficult place for construction projects. The Delt house project is no exception during these difficult times. We continue to work towards the goal of construction commencement and completion.

Our current plan is to start construction on the party pavilion and repositioning the sport court early in the fall semester. This should be complete by the start of the fall semester of 2022. The existing structure is still tied up with the city zoning, easements, and permitting. We should have greater clarity by the end of the summer on how to proceed. Our collegiate members are very excited about their new Shelter and the prospect of a new home greatly helps with recruitment efforts.

I want to formally acknowledge the Building Committee and thank them for their hard work to date, and their continued hard work to oversee this project. 
